"Come on in! Can I get you a drink? Did you hear the one about the couple who evaporated?"

Helen and Lloyd are a middle aged couple who recently moved to a small New England town. In their newfound isolation, they begin to question the various narratives that have long been the pillars of their shared reality. Join them for an evening of drinks, live music, dance, story telling and psychic turmoil.

House Warming as an intimate, immersive show for a small audience. Staged as a house party with you as our guests, House Warming combines the domestic parlor theatrics of Whose Afraid of Virginia Woolf? with the surreal, noir aesthetics of Daniel Clowes Eightball comics in an exploration on identity, isolation and the psychic entropy that tends to take hold when we feel ourselves closed off to the outside world.

Jesse Hawley and James Stanley did their first show together in 1997 in New York City. Since then they have collaborated on multiple projects, mostly with the OBIE winning Brooklyn based arts collective the National Theater of the United States of America (NTUSA.ORG), a company they co-founded with several conspirators between 2000 and 2001. The NTUSA created immersive spectacles, music and various material artifacts that engaged with the history of American popular entertainment. In their shows, they reimagined vaudevilles, self-help seminars, amusement park rides, Chautauquas, Victorian parlor theatricals and other historical forms to see what they could reveal of our cultural inheritance. Their shows have been presented at The Kitchen, PS122, the Chocolate Factory, the Public Theater (UTR), The Walker Center (MN), the Wilbury Theater (RI) and others venues. Their works have toured nationally and internationally and have been recognized with an OBIE Award, a Spalding Gray Award, the LMCC Presidents Award and two Henry Hewes Design Award nominations. Their illustrated acting manual A New Practical Guide to Rhetorical Gesture and Action — written with NTUSA collaborator Normandy Sherwood - was published by 53rd State Press in 2017, and was the NTUSA's final piece.

Outside of the company's work, Hawley has performed with **Richard Foreman**, **Ken Nintzel**, **Julianna Francis-Kelly**, **Mallory Catlett** and **Young Jean Lee**, among others. As a visual artist she designed murals and the book cover for Lee's *Songs of the Dragons..*, illustrated *Animals versus Furniture* (**Ugly Duckly Press**). Stanley has performed with **Young Jean Lee**, **Richard Maxwell**, **Darko Tresnjak**, **Joanna Settle**, and others.

In 2015, they relocated to Marion, Massachusetts and began a new set of experiments in theater and music in collaboration with New England based artists and theaters. Meanwhile, James Stanley works as **Artistic Producer of Theater**, **Dance and Media at Harvard University**, where he also teaches classes on immersive theater and making theater from archival sources. Jesse Hawley is the **Head of Drama at the Tabor Academy**, where she teaches acting, directing and design.

Leon Stanley is a multi-instrumentalist who will be starting middle school in Marion, MA in the fall of 2019. He plays trumpet, piano and old-time fiddle. Other interests include art, comedy and comics. Leon's own comics have been published in the South Coast magazine *The Wanderer*.

House Warming was developed at the Wilbury Theater in Providence, RI. Premiered there in 2017, and also performed in the B House Performing Garage/Shack in Beacon, NY in 2018.
